An excellent and fairly brief history of the crusader period.

Exploration of the character of Bernard of Clairvaux and some of his writing, showing the man’s complexity, and including both his good and bad aspects.

An expose of psychics and fortune tellers.

- ** Martin, Malachi, *Hostage to the Devil—The Possession and Exorcism of Five Americans*, Harper-Collins, 1992
A sober and excellent analysis of the reality of demon possession, and the incredible battles that are necessary to deliver individuals who have surrendered themselves to demonic forces.
- ***Peretti, Frank, *This Present Darkness & Piercing the Darkness*, Living Books, 2002
Novels which incorporate the reality of demons and how they influence today's world.

Economics, Banking, and Social Policy

- * Chernow, Ron, *The House of Morgan—An American Banking Dynasty and the Rise of Modern Finance*, Grove Press, 1990
An interesting, well-written history of dynasty of J.P. Morgan, but from a liberal globalist's perspective. It ignores and understates many of the concerns about financial power and how it has been employed for political purposes, and therefore tends towards being a puff piece.
- ** Gersemann, Olaf, *Cowboy Capitalism: European Myths and American Realities*, Cato Institute, 2004
A detailed comparison of the economic policies and conditions in the US compared to Germany, France, and Italy that totally devastates the lies and myths told in Europe about the American economy, and how socialistic forces in Europe serves the government and keeps everyone else poor.

The best book ever written on the subject of economics.

An excellent analysis of how the welfare system has failed and impoverished the very people it has tried to help.
- Perkins, John, *Confessions of an Economic Hit Man*, Berrett-Koehler Publishers, 2004
An interesting analysis of corporate/government collaboration and power politics written by an insider, but from a limited and completely one-sided perspective. The author is almost childish in his blindness to his own political biases.
- * Sowell, Thomas, *Affirmative Action Around the World*, Yale University Press, 2004
A scholarly investigation of the negative impact of affirmative action in several countries that have adopted preferential treatment legislation.
- * Sowell, Thomas, *Black Rednecks and White Liberals*, Encounter Books, 2005
A critical examination of black sociology, and how liberalism has distorted and exploited the issue of slavery; written by a black intellectual.
- ** Wheelan, Charles, *Naked Economics: Undressing the Dismal Science*, W.W. Norton & Company, 2002

An excellent introduction to the essential ideas in economics, with clear and interesting illustrations and without confusing charts and graphs.

Education

Two excellent summaries of the real history of American education, which has been obscured by the education hierarchy in order to conceal the facts. These books show how and why American children have been dumbed down, despite the astronomical sums that have been spent on education.

Excellent apocalyptic novels about world politics and trends.

An excellent and very readable work on the entire Plantagenet/Angevin dynasty, which includes both summary as well as excerpts from historians who were contemporaries of the Plantagenets.

European Union

- ** Booker, Christopher and Richard North, *The Great Deception: The Secret History of the European Union*, Continuum International Publishing, 2005
The best available work on the real history and goals of the European Union. As you read this history and begin to understand what has actually happened, you appreciate the sentiment of many people, summed up as “F*** the European Union and the French government!”

- * Connolly, Bernard, *The Rotten Heart of Europe: the Dirty War for Europe's Money*, Faber and Faber, 1996
An excellent book on the struggle to create and control the Euro and the European Central Bank, exposing the real story and motives behind the EU lies and propaganda, but containing economic detail which could be laborious for an average reader. It was written by an ex-EU Commissioner and insider who was fired for telling his story. The picture on the cover of the book is especially fitting; it depicts a statue of a nude boy standing on a monument dedicated to the EU, and the boy is pissing on a map of Europe below him which is covered with his urine.

An anti-EU screed book.
- McCormick, John, *Understanding the European Union*, Palgrave, 1999
A typical propaganda puff-piece about the EU.
- Pinder, John, *The European Union—A Very Short Introduction*, Oxford University Press, 2001
A paean to the benefits of the European super-state, written by a man enamored with global government, like the Bolsheviks and the communist fellow travelers who were enamored with the paradise of Russian communism under Lenin and Stalin.
- ** Yeor, Bat, *Eurabia: The Euro-Arab Axis*, Farleigh-Dickinson University Press, 2005
The seminal book on the history and goals of the Arab League, the EU, and other groups who have sought to create a union between the European and the Muslim world.

The classic Space Trilogy by the foremost contemporary Christian writer and thinker.

The root of modern fantasy novels.

The best fantasy novel ever written, in the opinion of this author. I owe much of my own intellectual development to this series of books.

Fiction

Anderson's stories, all of which he wrote himself, are the most poignant collection in existence. They are written primarily for adults, and his story of the Little Match Girl is one of the most powerful lessons of faith through suffering ever penned.

The best contemporary historical fiction ever written, in the opinion of this author. Clavell was a master at revealing the inner person of his characters without prejudging them. Unfortunately, Clavell's other novels did not reach as high as this one.
- ***Dumas, Alexander, *The Count of Monte Cristo*, Bantam Classics Unabridged Edition, 1985
The best older work of historical fiction work ever written, in the opinion of this author. Dumas, like Clavell, was a master of his craft.

A great psychological study of a wealthy alienated man, who from his deathbed considers his life and finally finds redemption.

A practical guide to the renewal of intimacy in marriage, written by a former feminist.

- ** Gilder, George, *Men and Marriage*, Pelican Publishing, 1992
A classic book on male/female relationships from the perspective of a sociologist. It is an update on Gilder's classic book *Sexual Suicide* which came out at the height of the feminist movement and made him a lightning rod for criticism.

An in-depth study of the myth of patriarchy from the perspective of anthropology and sociology. *Why Men Rule* is an update of the *The Inevitability of Patriarchy*.

Popular book on male/female differences and how the sexes can understand each other.

The classic book that first popularized the Priory de Sion, the Rennes de la Chateau legends, and the notion of the lineage of Jesus through Mary Magdalene. This book was the main source of ideas for Dan Brown's *Davinci Code*.

A popular and fast-paced novel relating supposed secrets in the works of Leonardo DaVinci to a secret society (the Priory de Sion) that possesses materials which the Catholic Church wants to destroy.

An interesting but pompous presentation of the purported bloodline of Christ, with *many* factual errors.

An insider's look at the world and the beliefs of Islam.

The Muslim Scriptures. Muslims also read and hold as influential various compilations of the life and teaching of Muhammad, known as the *Hadiths* and the *Sunnah*. They are considered as less important than the Quran, but nevertheless normative for Muslim life and belief.
